


## Smoke Free Areas

Under the *Tobacco Act 1987* 'smoking is banned at and within 10 metres of outdoor public children's playground equipment, skate parks and sporting venues during organised under-age sporting events, as well as in outdoor areas of public swimming pools.'

  - No personal information, such as your birthday or your name
  - Not been shared with other people
